with Val he got them fixed for me. Now, I don't necessarily think all Val's work is done in less than two week's turn around time but... well, I was adamant about needing them for the following JSR shoot – at that time less than two weeks away!

It wasn't as easy as reading this makes it sound. You see, Val ran into a real head-scratcher. He had timed my Navy Conversions, installed all the new parts, had them running slick as you please and still they would on occasion OVER ROTATE! Unlike a Peacemakers action the '51's hand does not keep the minute amount of pressure necessary on the cylinder to prevent it (the cylinder) from over rotating. Their needed to be something, some sort of friction, Val explained, to

prevent this brief moment where the cylinder was free to slip by. I believe he must have reached the boiling point at least once while trying to get to the bottom of this mystery (this is based on phone conversations we had...). As it turned out the solution came to him, like an e p i p h a n y .

Val explained it to me, in person, the following morning when I arrived to pick up my guns and with the visual (guns there in front of me) and his ability to explain the mechanics, I understood. These 51's need more LUBE. Yes, a good thick (consistency) lube, such as bore butter or the "secret" formula from Brownell's that Val used applied to the cylinder "rod" (those that are familiar with the 51 know

what I am talking about) provides just enough friction to prevent the cylinder from over rotating.

Chances are this was my problem all along. And while it is such a simple solution, it seemed as though it just had to be something worse – based on the way the revolver would act. I was lubricating everything well (I am liberal with the Ballistol) however, I don't think it's (Ballistol's) consistency is necessarily right for this particular application.

So (to get to the moral of the story), got a computer problem? Need some graphic design work done? Perhaps a web page designed? Come see me we'll talk... If'n ya want yer gun to work take it to Val.
