
2004 Friends of the NRA

Cowboy Action Shooting, which was a "Demonstration Sport" at the Huntsman World Senior Games in St. George, Utah last year now included as a "regular" sport along with softball, basketball, track and field events, bicycling, etc. The games are open to all persons 50 years old and above. Medals, similar to those of the Olympics, in gold, silver and bronze, are awarded to the top three competitors or teams in each event. Last year's event was a triumph for our own Line Century! Line wasn't able to compete this year due to his shoulder still giving him trouble, so Sweetwater Jack and Gaye Abandon went to keep the JSR banner high. (We probably should have sent Line, even WITH his bad shoulder) Gaye shot her best match yet and Sweetwater isn't talking....)

The match was held outside of

Washington City, Utah (about 5 miles north of St. George itself) and run by the Dixie Desperados at their Range. The main match was 10 stages, shot over two days, Thursday and Friday, with side matches the day before, and team shoots on Saturday. The stages were fun, as were the props. The home club was friendly and the weather warm but not TOO hot.

The Opening Ceremonies for the Games on Tuesday evening were great fun, with ALL the athletes (Yes, Cowboy Shooters were considered "athletes") parading onto the field at Dixie College with their flags to open the ceremonies. Of course we CAS folks were all in our cowboy finery, so we were put in the front of the parade, and got first choice in the seating in the bleachers to watch the entertainment as a result. The entertainment was pretty much what you'd see at half-time at a

major football game, plus some really impressive (flashy and loud- the best kind) fireworks at the end.

Food? Yep! A hamburger feed at the country club on Wednesday night, a Western Dinner-dance on Thursday night, 10 buck discount tickets for MANY restaurants (Most of the Oregon troops met at "Famous Dave's" BBQ on Friday night). Saturday night was the Cowboy Action Shooters' banquet and awards. There was also a BBO caterer at the range on the days we shot, that provided some great food for a reasonable price.

Even with the 2100 mile round-trip by pickup truck involved, we are considering going again next year. Now, if we could find someone ELSE that was going to drive, with enough room for our gun carts, firearms, ammo, costumes, etc., and WE could go by ...AIR......hmmmm?!
