"One of the most active posts on the SASS T/G Wire lately has been about the ever-growing size of the "Senior" shooting category. As our nation, and especially Cowboy Action Shooting, "matures" we are seeing the huge influx of those folks who were once known as "Baby Boomers" join the ranks of the Seniors. The Senior Category is fast becoming the largest category in CAS. The question has been brought up on how to

"handle" this category in the future. There were 106 "Senior Men" registered at End of Trail, the second-largest group shooting! One of the suggestions forwarded is to split the Senior Category in half, ages 60-64 as Seniors, 65-69 as Super Seniors. A second idea was to add the following to the Senior categories and leave the age-split alone:

Senior Frontier Cartridge, Senior Gunfighter, Senior Frontiersman, Senior Classic Cowboy, Ladies Senior Classic, and keeping Senior Duelist. As we all know, the "49'er" Cate-

gory was created in the same manner to reduce/manage the "Traditional" Category and has served the purpose very well. This subject, will, as I understand it, be a point of discussion at the T/G Summit in December. These changes would, if brought about, apply at State, Regional, and National levels and COULD be used at the Club level, if desired, but would not be mandatory. Please drop Col. Gilliam a line with YOUR thoughts on this subject so that he will be prepared to promote YOUR desires at the Summit"

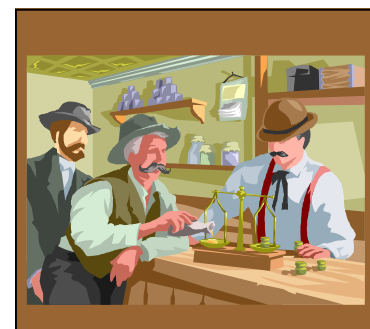
Strong Backs? Your help would be greatly appreciated in setting up the stages (steel and props) and with putting up the sun screen and setting up the tables in
