Stage Three was written by MT Dawson. This stage had the shooter robbing the E&G train with the help of the twin “brothers” J.D. Humpty and Jedi Dumpty....(uh, yeah, don't ask). This stage required the shooter to load two rounds into the rifle on

the clock for a total of 12 rifle shots, 10 pistol shots and 8 shots from the shotgun. The fastest time on this stage was by Purgatory, who shot it in 44.81 seconds.

Stage Four was written by me and actually turned out to be a fun stage (once the whining stopped). On this stage the shooting order was determined by cracking open plastic Easter eggs from an Easter basket. This stage required 10 rifle rounds, 10 pistol rounds and 4 shotgun rounds. Purgatory had the fastest time at 33.32 seconds.

April 10th, 2006

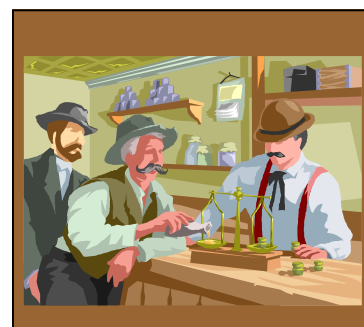

The following text is Proposed Amendments to Jefferson State Regulators' Bylaws that will be voted on at the June business meeting. All JSR members are welcome to attend the business meeting to vote on this document.

VII—Duties of Officers

Existing:

Treasurer—The Treasurer shall have charge of all funds of the Club and place the same in such bank, savings and loan association, or credit union located within Jackson County as may be approved by the Executive Committee. Such money shall only be withdrawn by check signed by the President, Vice President or by the Treasurer and for the payment of such bills as shall have been approved by the Executive Committee. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate account of all transactions and render a detailed report at the monthly meeting of the Executive Committee and at any annual or special meeting.

Replacement:

Treasurer—The Treasurer shall have charge of all funds of the Club and place the same in such bank, savings and loan association, or credit union located within Jackson County as may be approved by the Executive Committee. Such money shall only be withdrawn by check signed by one of the Officers and for the payment of such bills as shall have been approved by the Executive Committee as either specific or standing items, or below a dollar volume approved by the general membership. However, no checks made out to an Officer or a member of the Officer's family may be signed by that member. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate account of all transactions and render a detailed report at the monthly meeting of the Executive Committee and at any annual or special meeting where such a report is required.

VIII-Suspension or Expulsion

Insert new paragraph:

Participation of all Officers is a key element to the successful operation of the Club. Therefore all Officers are expected to attend annual, regular, and special meetings to the extent possible. Any officer unable to attend three consecutive regular meetings or unable to perform their duties may be suspended from his/her office without prejudice by a majority vote of the Executive Committee at any annual, regular, or special meeting, without prior notice to the officer, his/her absence being recognized as de facto notice of the situation. The Executive Committee may, at that same meeting, appoint an interim replacement for the office, who shall have all the authorities and responsibilities of the office, and serve until the suspended officer can again resume the elected office or a new annual election is held, whichever comes first. The Executive Committee shall notify the suspended officer of this action in writing. The suspended officer may resume his/her office by notifying the Club in writing of his/her intention to do so, and by approval of the Executive Committee relieving the interim officer of duties at the next regular or annual meeting following receipt of said notification.
