Proofing Jed I. Knight, #36423 Howdy all! 34 shooters came out to Ashland for the July match and enjoyed stages written by **The Col, Dawson**, **Harley, H. Apple Bob**, and myself. Special congratulations go out to this month's winner of a clean match **The Oxford Kid** (18<sup>th</sup> overall and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Modern category).

On Stage One, by Col. Cornelius Gilliam, the shooter got to blaze away with at least 10 shotgun rounds, 10 pistol rounds and throw a tomahawk for a bonus (if it stuck in it's designated target the shooter got the bonus!). Fastest time on this stage Cornelius was Col. **Gilliam** (1<sup>st</sup> place overall and in Frontier Cartridge).

Stage Two, by MT Dawson, had the shooter thwarting a train robbery and shooting it out with a card sharp. This stage required 10 rifle rounds, 10 pistol rounds and six shotgun rounds plus an on the clock reload of 3 rounds in the rifle. The fastest time on this stage was by Bear Bones **Smith** (2<sup>nd</sup> place overall and 1<sup>st</sup> in the Traditional category); he shot it in 52.18 seconds.

Stage Three was penned by Harley Davidson and had the shooter "plinking" at targets in a shooting gallery. On this stage the shooter fired 10 rifle rounds, 10 pistol rounds and 2 shotgun rounds in any order as long as all the "shooting gallery" targets were hit at least once. The stage ended with a ring toss; the shooter had to loop a lasso around a steeltarget-steer-head (success netted the shooter a 5 second bonus). The fastest time on this stage was by **Bear Bones Smith**; he shot it in 24.63 seconds.

Stage Four was written by H. Apple Bob and was a tribute to the late ISR shooter William Bonney Buckmaster. H. Apple also built a nice prop that he used on this stage and even though he wasn't shootin' in the heat he setup the stage for us and then stayed around to read the stage description and explain the shooting sequence. The stage requirements were 10 pistol rounds, 9 rifle and six shotgun rounds. The fastest time on this stage was **Col. Cornelius** Gilliam; he shot it in 31.90 seconds.


