Howdy all! February's JSR match brought out 42 shooters, including a buckaroo; The Kid Gunslinger, a Kookanadude buckarette; and two Young Guns; Crossfire Kid and Emmy Oakley. We are very happy to have you youngsters shooting with us... but remember it is considered very bad form to shoot faster than your mentors! All kidding aside you all are doing outstanding out on the range! Y'all are safe (our number one priority) and you're having fun. If you have any questions, or want to try different shootin' irons don't hesitate to ask - with approval of your "sponsors" all of us would be happy to help you out.

The top three shooters for February's match were 3rd

place, Purgatory Smith (Gunfighter, total time 166.85), 2nd place, Ramblin' Dave (Senior, total time 165.76) and 1st place went to Cornelius Gilliam (Frontier Cartridge, total time 162.46). As you can see by those scores it was a very tight race! Ramblin' Dave also managed to turn in February's only "Clean Match"... fast and accurate; way to go Dave!

Special thanks to all of our stage writers and to those that show up early to help set up steel.

Stage 1 was written by J.D. Walker. This stage, the JSR "shotgun stage" required a minimum of 12 shotgun rounds and 10 rounds out 2 pistols. The fastest time on the stage was by Ramblin' Dave (Senior), he shot it in 36.57 seconds.

Stage 2 "Cupid's Love" was a fun tale penned by Kookanadude and Harley David-In this stage the shooter, playing the role of Cupid, flew around town blasting hearts and cowboys. The stage required 2 pistols loaded with five rounds each, a shotgun with 4 rounds and a rifle loaded with 10 rounds. The fastest time on this stage was Col. Cornelius Gilliam (Frontier Cartridge) he shot it in 28.65 seconds!

Stage 3, "Double Ended Trouble", was written by Col. Cornelius Gilliam. This stage had the shooter hot on the trail of the outlaw pair JD Walker and Harr Trigger. The shooter needed 10 pistol rounds, 10 rifle rounds and a minimum of 8 shotgun rounds to stop JD and Harr! Fastest time was 37.12 seconds (Continued on Page 3)

Don't listen for the sound of ringing steel (some targets are "dead"); don't look to the other spotters to see what they came up with. Pay careful attention when counting - and if you are distracted by something tell the Timer Operator that when asked for your count.

Gaye Abandon's Chocolate Cheesecake

CRUMB CRUST:

Combine one cup fine Zweibach crumbs; 3 tablespoons sugar; 3 tablespoons melted butter; Stir in 1/3 cup finely chopped nuts. Press firmly into bottom and sides of a well-buttered 9 inch spring form pan. Bake in 350 degree oven for 10 minutes.

FILLING:

1 cup granulated sugar 3-8oz pkgs cream cheese, softened

2 pkgs (6 oz ea) semi-sweet 1 teaspoon vanillachocolate pieces, melted 1/8 teaspoon salt

1 cup dairy sour cream 3 eggs

Beat eggs and sugar together at high speed until light. Add cream cheese and beat until smooth. Add melted chocolate, vanilla, salt and sour cream. Beat until smooth. Turn into crumb crust and bake in 350 degree oven 1 hour or until cake is just firm when shaken gently. Cool in pan
