Stage Three, "Wild Riders", was written by Ied I. Knight. This story revolved around a gang of ruffians terrorizing the main streets of Middleford. The stage required

10 rounds from two pistols, 10 rounds from a rifle and minimum of 2 shotgun rounds (to knockdown the falling targets). Fastest time on the stage was 33.62 by Bear Bone **Smith** (Traditional).

Stage Four, "Rusty Star Gang", was written by Lithia Star (Young Gun). Lithia Stars story was about her and Shootin' Silver Star shootin' covotes and battling it out with a gang of rustler's. The stage required shooter to fire 10 rounds out of two pistols, 10 rounds out of a rifle and a minimum of 4 shotgun rounds. Fastest time was 22.95 by **Purgatory** Smith.
